

CITY COUNCIL MINUTES
NOVEMBER 5, 2024
6:00 P.M.

The Marshall City Council met in Regular Session at 6:00 p.m. on Tuesday, November 5, 2024 in the Council Chambers of the City Office Building, 214 N. Lafayette, Marshall, MO 65340, with the following members present: Mayor Vincent Lutterbie, Council Members Charles Guthrey, Craig Thompson, John Allen, Nathan Swisher, Steve Cook and Jim Papreck; City Counselor Elizabeth Bellamy, City Administrator JD Kehrman and Assistant City Clerk Diane Green. Council Members Dan Brandt and Drew Green excused absent.

Council Member Papreck made a motion, seconded by Thompson, to adopt the agenda as written. A voice vote was taken with all in attendance in favor; Green and Brandt excused absent. Motion carried.

Council member Guthrey made a motion, seconded by Papreck to approve the regular session minutes of October 15, 2024 and Special Session minutes of October 30, 2024. A voice vote was taken with all in attendance in favor; Green and Brandt excused absent. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION

A Resolution entitled “A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF MARSHALL MISSOURI, STATING INTENT TO SEEK FUNDING THROUGH THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ADMINISTRATION GRANT PROGRAM AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR AND MAYOR TO PURSUE ACTIVITIES IN AN ATTEMPT TO SECURE FUNDING” was read by title only.

Council member Guthrey made a motion, seconded by Allen, to approve the resolution. A roll call vote was taken with Allen, Swisher, Cook, Papreck, Guthrey and Thompson voting aye; Green and Brandt excused absent. The resolution is thereupon declared passed and so endorsed by the President of the Council, approved by the Mayor and numbered Resolution No. 2024-10.

ORDINANCES

An Ordinance entitled “AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR A GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON APRIL 8, 2025, IN THE CITY OF MARSHALL, MISSOURI FOR ELECTION OF CITY OFFICERS THEREIN” was given its first reading by title only.

Council Member Papreck made a motion, seconded by Thompson, to approve the first reading. A roll call vote was taken with Swisher, Cook, Papreck, Guthrey, Thompson and Allen voting aye; Green and Brandt excused absent. Motion carried.

An Ordinance entitled “AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CERTAIN SECTIONS OF ARTICLE III OF CHAPTER 125 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF MARSHALL,

MISSOURI, REGARDING THE COLLECTION OF COURT COSTS FOR THE MUNICIPAL COURT OF THE CITY OF MARSHALL” was given its first reading by title only.

Council Member Allen made a motion, seconded by Papreck to approve the first reading. A roll call vote was taken with Cook, Papreck, Guthrey, Thompson, Allen and Swisher voting aye; Green and Brandt excused absent. Motion carried.

An Ordinance entitled “AN ORDINANCE MAKING THE APPROPRIATION FOR THE PAYMENT OF ACCOUNTS OUT OF THE DIFFERENT CITY FUNDS” was given its first reading by title only.

Council Member Guthrey made a motion, seconded by Papreck, to take the ordinance to a second reading. A roll call vote was taken with Cook, Papreck, Guthrey, Thompson, Allen and Swisher voting aye; Green and Brandt excused absent. Motion carried.

Ordinance No. 8860 entitled “AN ORDINANCE MAKING THE APPROPRIATION FOR THE PAYMENT OF ACCOUNTS OUT OF THE DIFFERENT CITY FUNDS” was given its second reading by title only and put to its final passage and approval upon motion of Thompson, seconded by Allen. A roll call vote was taken with Papreck, Guthrey, Thompson, Allen, Swisher and Cook voting aye; Green and Brandt excused absent. The Ordinance is thereupon declared passed and so endorsed by the President of the Council and approved by the Mayor.

OTHER COUNCIL BUSINESS

Council Member Thompson asked the status on a sinkhole behind Eastwood School. He had concerns regarding school kids getting hurt and could there be some kind of fencing installed around it. City Administrator Kehrman said he will get with Municipal Service Director Randy Cornine and address the issue.

There being no other Council Business, Council Member Swisher made a motion, seconded by Allen to adjourn the meeting. A voice vote was taken with all in attendance in favor; Green and Brandt excused absent. Motion carried and the meeting adjourned at 6:34 p.m.
