

CITY COUNCIL MINUTES
NOVEMBER 4, 2025
6:00 P.M.

The Marshall City Council met in Regular Session at 6:10 p.m. on Tuesday, November 4, 2025 in the Council Chambers of the City Office Building, 214 N. Lafayette, Marshall MO 65340, with the following members present: Mayor Pro Tem Nathan Swisher, Council Members Jim Papreck, Jeremy Gibson, Carter Fawkes, John Allen and Harold Simmons; City Administrator JD Kehrman, City Counselor Elizabeth Bellamy and Assistant City Clerk Diane Green. Mayor Craig Thompson excused absent. Council Members Drew Green and Dan Brandt excused absent.

Council Member Papreck made a motion, seconded by Allen, to adopt the agenda as written. A voice vote was taken with all in attendance in favor. Motion carried.

Council Member Simmons made a motion, seconded by Papreck, to approve the Special Session Minutes of October 15, 2025 and Regular Session Minutes of October 21, 2025. A voice vote was taken with all in attendance in favor. Motion carried.

BUSINESS FROM THE AUDIENCE:

There was no business from the audience.

DISCUSSION AND APPROPRIATE FOLLOW UP:

Council Member Fawkes stated the Street Sweeper came in under budget and was made in the USA. Council Member Papreck asked about the warranty. There being no further discussion, Council Member Papreck made a motion, seconded by Simmons to accept the quote in the amount of \$221,628.00 for the Tymco 435 Regenerative Air Sweeper on a 2026 Freightliner M2-106 plus Chassis. A voice vote was taken with all in attendance in favor. Motion carried.

ORDINANCES

An ordinance entitled " AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR A GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON APRIL 7, 2026, IN THE CITY OF MARSHALL, MISSOURI FOR ELECTION OF CITY OFFICERS THEREIN" was given its first reading by title only.

Council Member Simmons made a motion, seconded by Allen to approve the first reading. A roll call vote was taken with Papreck, Gibson, Fawkes, Allen, and Simmons voting aye. Brandt and Green excused absent; Swisher abstain. Motion carried.

An ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE MAKING THE APPROPRIATION FOR THE PAYMENT OF ACCOUNTS OUT OF THE DIFFERENT CITY FUNDS" was given its first reading by title only.

Council Member Papreck made a motion, seconded by Simmons, to take the ordinance to a second reading. A roll call vote was taken with Gibson, Fawkes, Allen, Simmons, Papreck voting aye. Brandt and Green excused absent; Swisher abstain. Motion carried.

Ordinance 8910 entitled “AN ORDINANCE MAKING THE APPROPRIATION FOR THE PAYMENT OF ACCOUNTS OUT OF THE DIFFERENT CITY FUNDS” was given its second reading by title only and put to its final passage and approval upon motion of Simmons, seconded by Gibson. A roll call vote was taken with Fawkes, Allen, Simmons, Papreck and Gibson voting aye. Brandt and Green excused absent, Swisher abstain. The ordinance is thereupon declared passed and so endorsed by the President of the Council and approved by the Mayor Pro Tem.

OTHER COUNCIL BUSINESS

There was no other council business.

Council Member Simmons made a motion, seconded by Gibson, to adjourn the meeting. A voice vote was taken with all in attendance in favor. Motion carried and the meeting adjourned at 6:20 p.m.
